American Indians in California

- ▶ The AIAN population in California is diverse
- ▶ CA has the largest population of AIANs in the US (over 723,000)
- ▶ 1 in 7 AIANs in the US lives in CA
- ▶ CA is home to 110 Federally recognized Tribes
- ▶ Over 50 non-Federally recognized Tribes
- ▶ 24% live in rural areas
- ▶ 76% live in urban areas
- ▶ 32 Tribal Health Clinics
- ▶ 8 Urban Indian Health Programs

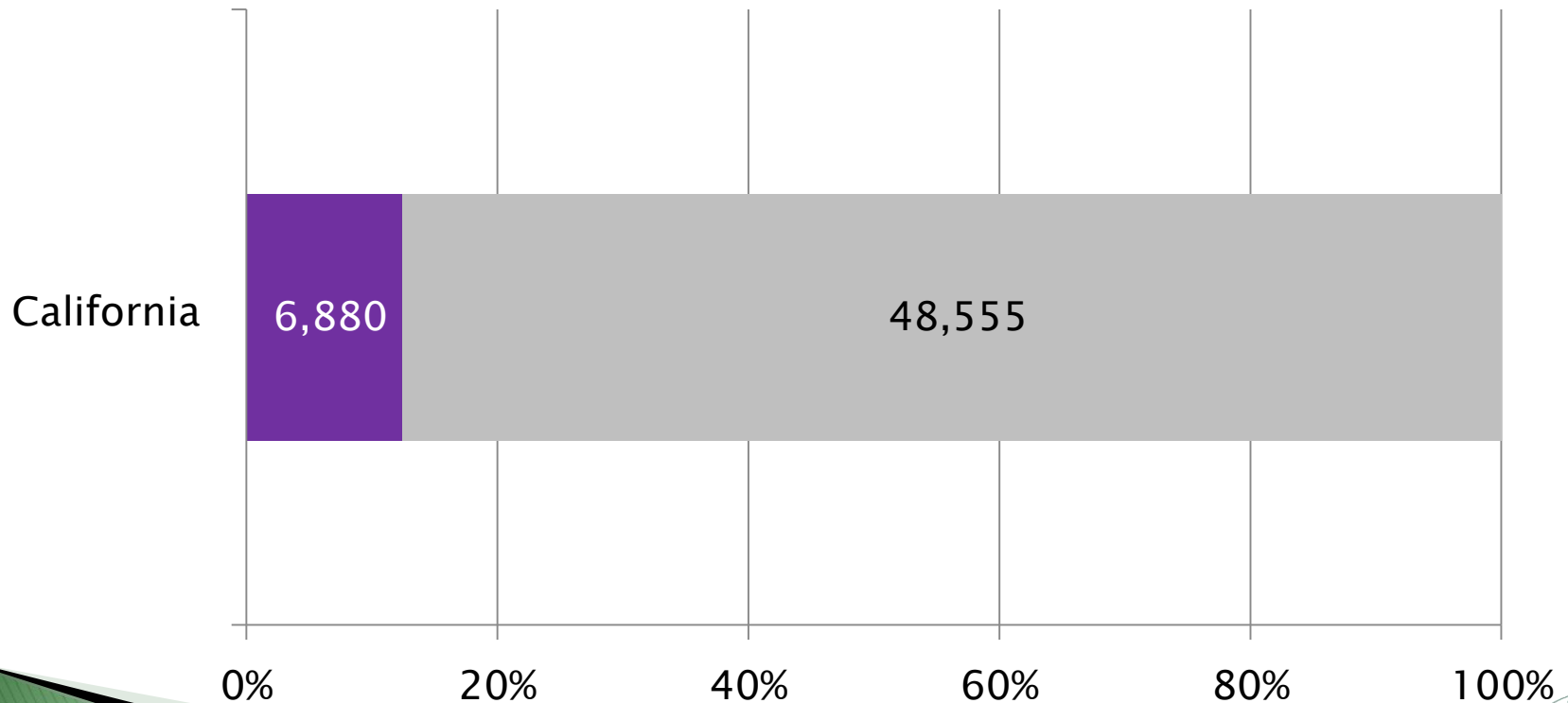


Uninsured AIAN in California

- ▶ 132,000 AIANs are uninsured, nearly 20% of the total AIAN population in California.
- ▶ 55,435 of the uninsured are under 138% of FPL and eligible for MediCal in 2014—many already eligible with early expansion.
- ▶ 60,000 of the uninsured are in the 138% to 400% of the FPL and possibly eligible for subsidies in the exchange. High estimate is over 80,000.
- ▶ There is no poverty rate adjustment for the higher cost of living in Metropolitan CA despite a cost of living that is higher than Anchorage, Alaska in nearly all the 7 largest metros.

■ IHS System AIAN ■ Other AIAN



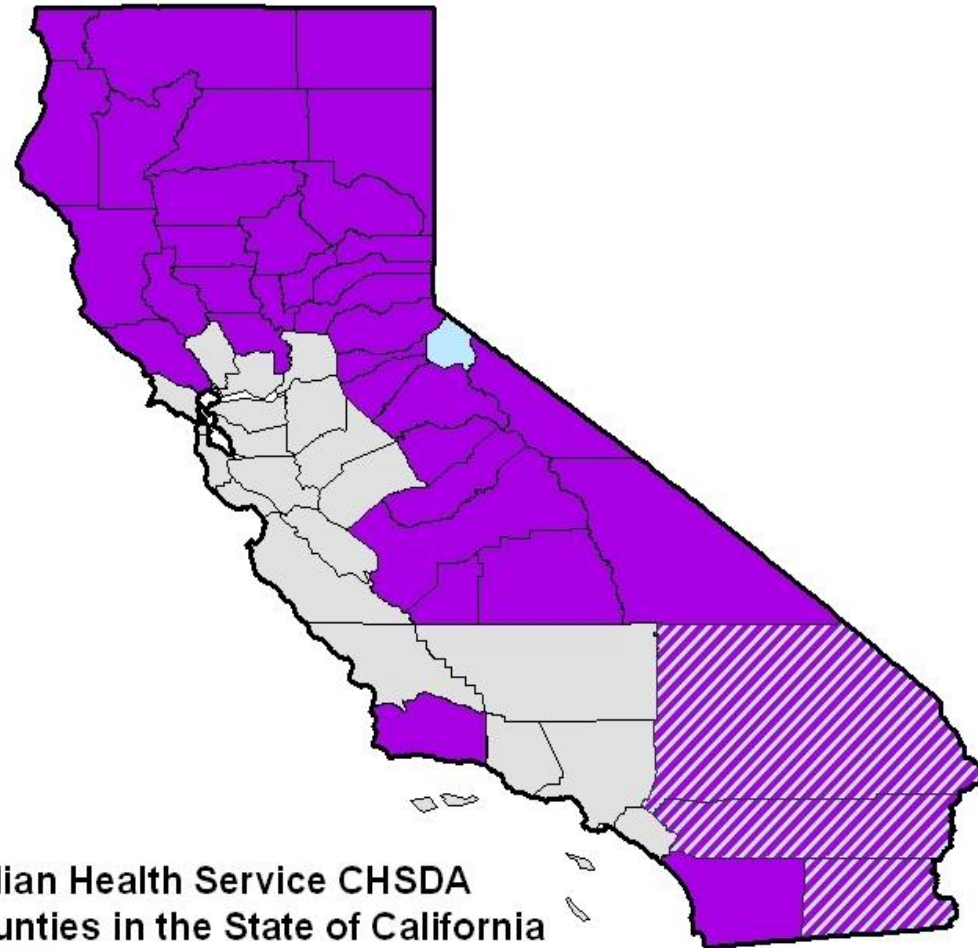
Urban Counties

- ▶ 55,435 uninsured AIAN in the state of California, 21,547 (39%) are in the urban counties served by IHS funded Urban Indian Health Programs
 - Alameda, Contra Costa, Fresno, Kern, Los Angeles Madera, Marin, Sacramento, San Diego, San Francisco, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Barbara, Santa Clara, Tulare and Ventura
 - 8% of those urban uninsured AIAN are in the IHS system and 92% are not.



Urban Counties

- ▶ Fresno and San Diego Counties are also Contract Health Service Delivery Area (CHSDA) counties
 - 52.38% of the AIAN service population in Fresno is assigned to the non-CHSDA part of the county,
 - 24% of the AIAN service population in San Diego County is assigned to the non-CHSDA part of the county.

Covered California

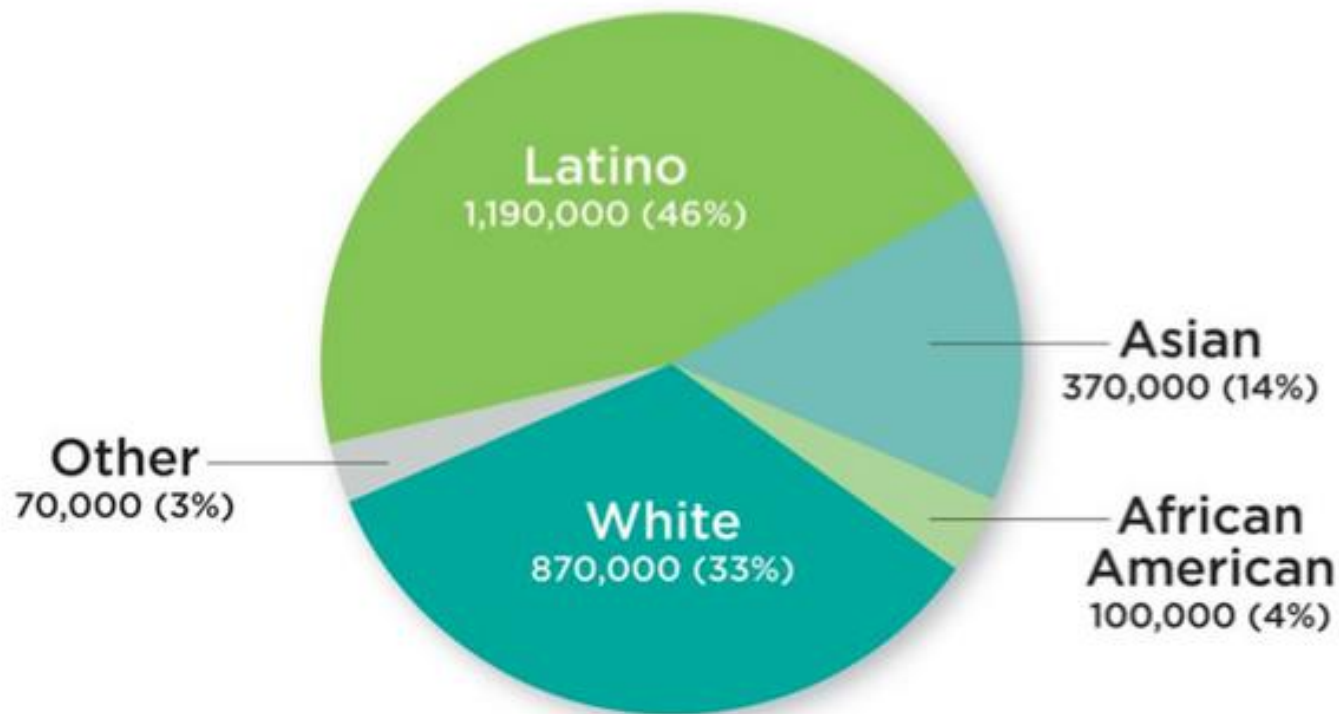
- California one of the first states to set up a health insurance exchange
- Governing Board of 5, including CA HHS Secretary Diane S. Dooley
 - Meets monthly
- Apply for coverage on their website
 - If applicant eligible for Medi-Cal and turns it down, will not be eligible for premium assistance

Special Provisions for AIAN

- Change health plan once per month
- Enroll at any time
- AIAN enrolled in a marketplace plan: no cost sharing (co-pays and deductibles) up to 300% FPL
 - \$34,470 for an individual
 - \$71,000 for a family of four
- Tribal members exempt from tax penalty if they do not have health insurance coverage

- ▶ Families USA Estimate – 3,473,000 All Races CA
- ▶ AIAN % of State Population – 1.90%
- ▶ Families USA Estimate by % of Population – 65,987
- ▶ Ratio of All Races to AIAN 139–400% FPL – 115.6%
- ▶ Number of AIANs Between 139–400% of FPL – 76,303
- ▶ Factor for Higher Rate of Un-insurance Among AIANs – 7,630
- ▶ **Adjusted Estimate of AIAN Eligible – 83,933**
